



Jerome Sagun Manaois Diploma in Culinary Arts Semester 6




ART AND LAB CRAFT OF EARLY CHILDHOOD EDUCATION



The person in charge for the art and craft of Early Childhood Education room is Encik Muhammad Azim bin Sharil, who is a lecturer of Early Childhood in Faculty of Education and Humanities. He has been working as a lecturer for almost nine years in UNITAR International University.



The art and craft room can be called as a messy place where students can and require to make it messy for studies purposes. There is only one reason that people should go for Early Childhood Education in UNITAR International University, which is in UNITAR the students not only study the theory but they also learn practically from the competence lecturers that are teaching the art and creativity subjects like Encik Muhammad Azim himself. Students will study theoretically, then practise in class, and implement the skills with children during their internship.





The art and craft room has been using for the subjects that are related to practical activities. As an example, the subjects that are related to practical activities are Projects in teaching creativity art in children, Children's toy and play, Puppetry in Early Childhood Education, Art and Craft for Young Children and so on. There are lots of books in KMC like education books based on the faculty programme in UNITAR; books that are related to the faculties at UNITAR such as History, Management, Accounting, Cooking, and more. Additionally, KMC has an online database where students can find journals especially when it is related to their assignments.





There are three online databases which includes: ProQuest, Emerald, and Lexis. KMC has subscribed to a number of journals for UNITARians. In order to borrow physical books, students have to give their matric card to the KMC, and after the staff has scanned it, they may swiftly borrow the books. In KMC, undergraduates may borrow a maximum of six books for two weeks while postgraduates may borrow ten volumes for one month. If they surpass the deadline by more than one day, they will be charged 30 cents each day.

Wing B of the KMC also contains eight discussion rooms. In order to use discussion rooms, a group of students must consist of three to six persons, present their matriculation card at the desk, and acquire the room's key for approximately two hours of use. All new and current UNITAR International University students are welcome to use the KMC's physical books, e-books, and discussion rooms for academic purposes.



CAREER PLACEMENT CENTRE (CPC)



Career Placement Centre (CPC) is the primary satellite location for PERKESO's MyFutureJobs Portal. MyFutureJobs is a portal to connect unemployed Malaysians with employment opportunities and internships for students. In addition, UNITAR CPC will include the list of companies that have approached the CPC in the shared file that has been emailed to students. There are posters in front of CPC with QR codes that students can scan and the list of companies actively seeking internship students will be updated periodically.

Mr. Safrizal (AKA Mr. Riz) is an officer of Career Placement Centre in UNITAR International University. He is the person in charge for industrial relations and any industry partners that are available, in efforts to expand the network of opportunities for UNITARians.





UNITARians can easily explore more information on companies that are looking for employees and have approached UNITAR directly. Students can also look for their internship or jobs by themselves especially using the MyFutureJobs portal.

In the MyFutureJobs portal, the students must register an account, then it will have options such as looking for full time jobs or internships. This is beneficial for those who stay outside of Lembah Klang, Selangor or those staying at other states.
